New Initiatives/Program Highlights

- Small Business Initiative
 - Significantly reduced fees for certain eligible companies
 - Total Upfront Savings of \$1,470
 - Gives more new companies the ability to break into the hauling market
 - Fees had not been reduced for any class of Haulers in the 25-year history of the Commission.



Ongoing Initiatives – Identify unlicensed Transfer Stations within the County

- LICENCEES
 - Added 6 new transfer stations in 2024
 - Identified 2 additional transfer stations which we expect to license in 2025
 - Increased number of companies licensed with the Solid Waste Commission from 566 in 2023 to 630 in 2024

New Initiatives/Program Highlights

- Unlawful Transfer Station on <u>State</u> Owned Land –
- Located under 1287 overpass in Elmsford
- Received a number of industry and non-industry related complaints about the storage of large piles of tires, Construction and Demolition debris and garden and yard waste
- Also used for private container and truck storage
- Collaborated with NYS Department of Transportation and NYS Department of Environmental Conservation
- SWC succeeded in having the violators clean out the property and vacate within 30 days
