Naturally Essential

County Parks more essential than ever as COVID-19 grips Westchester

Park Safe Havens - Safe outdoor activities for physical and mental health.

- Trailways, Nature Centers, Parks system-wide experience unprecedented daily visits early on.
- Golf Courses socially distanced operations on track for a record year of rounds and revenue.

Activities Reinvented - Safe recreation within New York State Guidelines

- Beach and Pools - serviced hundreds of thousands; beach season extended.
- Bicycle Sundays - expands from three months to six months.
- Children's Outdoor Summer Camps - offer families relief.
- Outdoor Movies - Croton Point, Playland Park, Kensico Dam Plaza.
- Ballfields - reopen for practice and socially distanced games.
- New Halloween and Holiday Train Shows - Lasdon Park and Arboretum.
- Outdoor fitness programs - Yoga and fitness classes.
- Playgrounds - reopen in the fall.
- Pumpkin Patch - Muscoot Farm.
- Volunteer Programs and Pitch in for Park - system-wide.
- New Winter Wonderland Drive-Thru – Kensico Dam Plaza.

Core Programs & Functions

Facilities Transformed – Pandemic requires public needs and indoor closings.

- County Center – converted to COVID-19 hospital.
- Glen Island – parking lot converted to COVID-19 testing site.
- Lenoir Preserve – “Ribbons of Remembrance” Memorial established.
- Playland Amusement Park, Ice Casino and Children’s Museum – temporarily closed.

Capital Projects – Construction continues on.

- Bronx River Pathway – Scarsdale to Hartsdale underway.
- Croton Point Park – camping facilities, site work, bridges near completion.
- George’s Island – pavilion, pathways, playgrounds complete.
- Glen Island Seawall – near completion.
- Merestead – enveloping of historic house continues.
- Playland – construction on historic Carousel and Derby Racer rides continue.
- North County Trailway – almost completed.
- Tibbetts Brook / Saxon Woods – state of the art synthetic fields open.
- Ward Pound Ridge Reservation – camping facilities near completion.
